## CLOSED MEETING - No votes taken or announcements made

The Board of Supervisors held a closed meeting in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act where such consultation or briefing in open meeting would adversely affect negotiation or litigation. Discussed: appointments to the CPMT, Community Services Board, Office on Youth Advisory Board, Parks and Recreation Commission, and personnel. There also was discussion concerning the new Courthouse, a site for Prices Fork Elementary School, a proposed boundary line adjustment – Town of Blacksburg, the Virginia Tech April 16 incident and the Norfolk Southern Intermodal Rail Facility proposal.

## PUBLIC HEARINGS

Citizens were invited to speak about several easement right-of-way requests by American Electric Power. Deferred until the April 28 meeting: an ordinance requested by Reese Family Limited Partnership rezoning approximately 227 acres from Agriculture to Rural Residential, an ordinance requested by Rhondy L. Martin and Margene Ward Martin 1997 Trust for rezoning approximately 18 acres from Agriculture to Rural Residential.
