


May 2024 Updates:

VOLUNTEER MONTGOMERY:

Expanding Volunteer Efforts for all in our Community

Montgomery County has had a flourishing volunteer program dating back to 1969. Formerly, the organization was known as the Retired Senior and Volunteer Program of Montgomery County and Radford (RSVP). However, RSVP was only open for senior citizens aged 55+ to join. In April of 2023, RSVP evolved to become Volunteer Montgomery in order to broaden volunteer efforts and welcome all individuals within the community of Montgomery County to unite together as volunteers and strengthen the community by doing so.

Volunteer Montgomery has two main functions for the community:

1. Serving as a community hub and offering "in-house" volunteer opportunities.

We partner with 60+ organizations located mainly in Montgomery County that are seeking volunteers, to provide various community service opportunities. Some of our partners include the American Red Cross, Montgomery County Animal Care and Assistance, Lewis Gale Hospital, the Montgomery County Emergency Assistance Program, and many more. Once an individual enrolls with Volunteer Montgomery, a staff member schedules and conducts a one-on-one orientation to discuss the individual's skills, preferences, and availability. Based on this discussion, Volunteer Montgomery staff connect enrolled individuals to one or more of our many partners so that they can start volunteering. Enrolled members also receive monthly newsletters as well as additional updates about potential volunteer opportunities within the area. We are happy to be able to welcome volunteers of all ages! Our current focus is on getting awareness out about Volunteer Montgomery and the fact that everyone, no matter the age or capability, has a volunteer opportunity that is perfect for them. We want folks to feel that they are fully participating in their community, getting to know others with the same passion for service, and contributing to the community. While donations are always happily encouraged and accepted, our primary hope is to assist folks with finding purpose while giving back to the community we love.

- 2. Volunteer Montgomery has multiple in-house volunteer opportunities that volunteers can participate in as well. Below, you will find a listing of our annual major events along with a brief summary.
- Supplies for Homebound Seniors: Occurring every January, our Supplies for Seniors event focuses on providing household items and hygiene products to

homebound seniors and veterans within Montgomery County. We work with the NRV Agency on Aging and Virginia Veteran and Family Support to identify seniors and veterans in need of the bags. Our volunteers fundraise tirelessly throughout the year so that we can purchase the items for the bags. They then bag all of the items up, and we collaborate with local police departments in order to make deliveries throughout the county. This past year, 230 bags valued at approximately \$50 per bag were delivered.

- Valentine's for Vets: Every February, we participate in the National Salute to Veteran Patients by crafting valentines for the Salem VA Medical Center and Virginia Veterans Care Center in Salem. We hold a craft day at our office where supplies are provided for volunteers to create valentines. This February, we were able to deliver 490 handcrafted valentines.
- Scholarships: Each year we sponsor two \$1,000 scholarships available for seniors in Montgomery County Public Schools to apply to. Applicants must be seeking further education (whether 2-year university, 4-year university, or technical school) in a Human Services related field.
- Patriot Day Activity: Each September volunteers put together donations of treats and goodies for all of our first responders within the County. We were able to deliver these goody baskets to 17 first responder locations throughout the county.
- Flowers for Veterans: Every November we choose to honor our veterans by creating and delivering flower arrangements. We collect vase donations throughout the year and partner with Gates Florist for the flowers. Volunteers deliver arrangements to veterans at four of our local assisted living facilities.
- Holiday Tote Bag Project: In December, we request
 donations of filled bags to deliver to one of our local
 assisted living facilities. We provide the tote bags along
 with a list of recommended items to donate. Volunteers
 prep the bags and deliver them (along with Santa and
 Mrs. Claus!) to one of our local assisted living facilities.
 This past year, we were able to deliver 100 tote bags to
 English Meadows in Blacksburg.

Evening Opportunity! Create a No Sew Fleece Blanket for Project Linus at Volunteer Montgomery – Tuesday, May 14th from 6-8 pm

Volunteers of all ages are welcome to join us as we welcome Penny Sweet, Regina Howard, and Laura Eanes of Project Linus. The ladies will provide all of the materials needed and a demonstration on how to make the blankets. **All supplies will be provided by Project Linus.**

This is one event not to miss if you would like to begin creating blankets for Project Linus, a nonprofit organization that provides blankets to children in emergency situations.

Blankets are distributed to a variety of locations in the New River Valley. Sheriff's Departments and local police departments carry blankets with them to provide comfort to children in crises situations. Fire departments have blankets to distribute in times of need. Local neo-natal intensive care units give blankets to children in their hospital beds. Social services distributes blankets to children who have to be relocated on an emergency basis. Blankets are given to children who have parents deployed in the line of duty. MCEAP Meal Delivery

Montgomery County Emergency Assistance Program (MCEAP) is run entirely by volunteers, providing a thrift store, food banks, and other opportunities. Right now, MCEAP is in need of drivers to help deliver a prepared meal for seniors in need in the Shawsville, Elliston, and Riner/Auburn areas. **Volunteers are needed for recurring deliveries on Thursdays**. If you are interested in helping with meal deliveries with MCEAP, please contact Margie Vitale at 540-449-2415.

Interested volunteers can stop by 400 West Main St. or 308 W. Main St. in Christiansburg between the hours of 10 am and 2 pm to pick up meal(s) to deliver to clients. MCEAP has a questionnaire prepared to ask clients if they are in need of pet food or adult diapers. If so, these items can be provided with the next meal delivery.

A "Purricane Prep Pawty" will be held at the Montgomery County Animal Care and Adoption Center (ACAC), 480 Cinnabar Road, Christiansburg, on Saturday, May 18 from 12-3 pm. The Animal Care and Adoption Center is requesting supplies to help care for the flood of tiny felines that make landfall soon.

They are collecting the following items. Kitten Formula (Kitten Milk Replacer) powder, Purina Kitten Chow (yellow bag), "Pate" wet adult or kitten food, Non-clumping Clay Litter, "Yesterday's News" (or any brand) paper litter, Kitten nursing bottles and replacement nipples, Miracle Nipples (mini and original), Digital thermometer, Flea combs, Fleece blankets, Small cat beds, Double sided food bowls, "Snuggle Kitty or Puppy" stuffed toy with heartbeat, Toys, Treats, Laundry soap (liquid), and Dawn "Ultra" dish soap (blue).

The ACAC encourages the community to stop by to enjoy the festivities, including a visit from The National Weather Service in Blacksburg.

Saint Francis Service Dogs

Saint Francis Service Dogs in Roanoke, VA is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to help people with disabilities achieve their goals and have greater independence through partnership with exceptional service and facility dogs. We have formed a new partnership with this wonderful agency and they are in need of volunteers in Montgomery County!

They have many volunteer opportunities for people to get involved, but **their biggest need at the moment is puppy sitters and puppy raisers.**

- **Puppy/Dog Sitters** care for Saint Francis puppies and dogs on weekends or for periods of one or two weeks while their regular puppy raisers are on vacation, or to give dogs in training a change of scenery. Sitters help Saint Francis puppies and dogs by exposing them to new friends and different places.
- **Puppy Raisers** open their homes and hearts to future service dogs, raising puppies for approximately one year, and helping them learn their basic obedience skills before returning them to Saint Francis Service Dogs for advanced training. Puppy Raisers must attend weekly training classes. They have classes in both Blacksburg and Roanoke.

Dear Friends at Volunteer Montgomery,

We want to sincerely thank you for your donation of food for Backpacks of Blessings. Your donation of food and your community support means that together we will help feed more children better food. For the 2023-2024 school year we will provide an estimated 3096 bags to children in need in the Auburn school strand. At the current cost per bag of \$9.62 the potential cost for the year could be as high as \$29,784, but because of donations of money and food like yours we are on track to spend only \$19,614. This is only possible because we are all working together to feed these kids and be the hands and feet of Christl Here is an update for the 2023-2024 school year:

- Auburn Elementary School 58 bags per week
- Auburn Middle School 15 per week
- Auburn High School 13 per week
- Total bags by May 2024 = 3096
